Upcoming Service Change


THE BUSLOAD Useful LBT Tips



Open Enrollment Ending

Open Enrollment closes on Aug. 25, 2023, and you will not be able to make plan changes - such as adjusting coverage or adding/removing a depending - unless you experience a qualified life event.

There are no plan changes, but you will notice an increase to your medical contributions effective Oct. 1, 2023.



Due to the prevalent cybersecurity threats across the globe, IT would advise our users to practice these safety tips:

- 1. Use strong and unique passwords at least 15 characters long and include a mix of upper- and lower-case letters, numbers and special characters. Avoid using common words, phrases, or personal information like birthdays.
- 2. Enable Two-Factor Authentication wherever possible. This adds an extra layer of security by requiring a second form of verification, like a text message or an authentication app.
- 3. Avoid opening attachments or clicking links from unknown or suspicious email senders. Be cautious of emails asking for personal or financial information. Legitimate companies typically don't ask for sensitive data via email.
